



EDGMONT TOWNSHIP BOARD OF SUPERVISORS
CONTINUED MEETING MINUTES
March 16, 2026 (Cont'd from March 10, 2026)

The March 10th, 2026 continued monthly meeting of the Edgmont Township Board of Supervisors was held at the Edgmont Township Municipal Building, 1000 Gradyville Road, Newtown Square, PA 19073 and via Zoom on March 16, 2026, beginning at 3:00 PM.

In attendance were Chair Anne Thorne; Vice-Chair Lindsey Conan; Supervisor David Teter; Township Solicitor Patrick McKenna, Esquire; and Township Manager Kenneth D. Kynett, Esquire. There were three in-person guests in attendance. There were no guests present via the Zoom platform.

- I. Call to Order & Pledge of Allegiance
 - a. Chair Thorne called the meeting to order at 3:00 PM with the Pledge of Allegiance.

- II. Old Business
 - a. Drop Box Renewal Agreement with the Delaware County Bureau of Elections
 - i. Chair Thorne asked Solicitor McKenna to briefly describe the changes made to the original Ballot Drop Box License Agreement. Township Solicitor McKenna did so and explained he had prepared Resolution No. 16 of 2026, as required by the Intergovernmental Cooperation Act for the Board to consider. Township Solicitor McKenna stated the License Agreement would be attached to the Resolution and become part of it to be sent back to the County. Township Solicitor McKenna stated he believed that the Act permitted a term of ten (10) years as the Agreement was between governmental entities.
 - ii. Supervisor Teter made a motion to approve Resolution No. 16 of 2026, Approving an Intermunicipal Agreement to Grant a License to the County of Delaware to Locate a Ballot Drop Box, Security Camera System, and Signage on Edgmont Township Property, as presented by the Township Solicitor with a second by Chair Thorne.
 - iii. Public comment was made by Vince DiPillo from Rosewood Lane in favor of keeping the Drop Box, stating that there have been no issues with it to date and that he believes it provides a service to residents.*
 - iv. Anthony DiPillo from Rosewood Lane spoke in favor of keeping the Drop Box stating that he didn't understand the concerns and that it is hard enough to get by as it is and this is one thing that makes life easier.
 - v. James Dougherty from Stackhouse Mill Road questioned the cost to the Township and what will happen to the Drop Box if the SAVE Act passes.
 - vi. There being no more public comment, Chair Thorne called for a vote. Chair Thorne and Supervisor Teter voted in favor of Resolution No. 16 of 2026 (and thereby approval of the Ballot Box License Agreement), with Vice-Chair Conan voting against the motion. There was no further discussion.

* During public comment on the Ballot Drop Box, Mr. Vince DiPillo inquired whether Township meetings are recorded so they can be viewed at a later date and also inquired whether the Township would consider doing so.

III. Adjournment

At 3:09 PM, Vice-Chair Conan made a motion to adjourn the meeting with a second by Supervisor Teter. There was no further discussion, and the motion passed unanimously.
